# Our Recent Open Exhibitions at Hall Place Stables Gallery.

We managed to restart these following Lockdown, not quite back to normal as we had to manage without Selectors and were not able to have an Artist Day with the Mayor opening the exhibition, but at least we had exhibitions running again. We were delighted to have had so many great works of art in the exhibitions, reflecting the talent of local people.

The gallery is not great with the shop taking up valuable exhibition space and many members have complained about this, but there is a shortage of exhibition space in Bexley, so we have to tolerate what is available. Another victim of Covid is that there are not so many 3D or sculpture works as before, it has been easier to paint at home during Lockdown than to create sculptures.







### Classes in the Local Area.

We have seen the cost of classes in the Adult Education Colleges rocket, even before Covid, many art tutors have started their own classes in Community Centres and halls. These typically cost about 1/3 of the cost of an equivalent class in the Adult ed Colleges. Some went on-line due to Lockdown, but most have returned to face-to-face classes.

This works great for painting and drawing, but is not so good for sculpture and pottery that needs specialist equipment.

Pottery classes have been particularly affected and one of our members sent the following to me:

"The previous April I paid for an 8 week course which worked out at £11.25 per hour (this is for 2 sessions each week which is my normal time)

On the morning of 24th June when enrolments started I paid £216 for 12 weeks which is £9 per hour. Several of my friends did the same. The same afternoon others enrolled and were told that a mistake had been made and the cost had risen to £433.50 which is just over £18 per hour."

This is clearly unacceptably high for most people, but pottery needs equipment that is difficult to provide in a Community Centre.

There are now so many classes and groups that it makes sense for us to get list of contacts, so if you attend a class locally or are part of a group, let me know and I will put the details on the website.

#### Music

Covid affected all branches of the arts, but it is funny how we adapt to new challenges.

One thing that helped was the internet. For music at the start of Lockdown, I started using a Program called

JamKazam that enabled people to play live across the internet.

It is a bit like Zoom, but specially designed for people to play music with other people across the internet. Zoom does not work as there is too much delay (latency) for a group of people playing together live.

The basic JamKazam program is free, but upgraded versions cost a small amount monthly. I use it playing with friends across the UK and so does my son playing with his friends.

There are limitations as a friend who plays the clarinet, has used it with three other clarinets, two at widely separated points in the USA with the other in Germany. He said it does not always work too well with this geographical spread. Using it across the UK, it generally works fine, once you get the hang of it. There is video on it, but it works better if you turn the



video off. You do need a fast audio input to your computer, I use a Steinberg UR22C and for speed to cut down latency, you need a wired internet connection to your computer, not WiFi.

It's not as good as playing live with other people, but very convenient. You still get a small amount of delay (latency), a bit like when there is an organ at one end of a church and the choir at the other end.

### Remembering Brenda

Following the sad death of Brenda Hamblin our former Chair of Bexley Arts Trust, we gave a donation in her memory to Trinity Laban for their Jazz students, as did her family. Brenda was a great lover of Jazz and it was fitting that this was chosen.

We were delighted to be invited by Trinity Laban to listen to a concert put on by their students to showcase Brenda's legacy. They do a great job educating young people to be our future jazz artists.
